It's a real honour to be the new MP for Tatton. Thank you for voting for me and for all the support and encouragement I have received since becoming your MP.

It's been a busy few months getting around the constituency; meeting with residents, community groups and local businesses as well as speaking up in Parliament on matters that affect Tatton - the first of which was on school funding for the area, see article below.

Rest assured as your local MP I will always work hard, be accessible and represent your interests.

Raising your concerns in Parliament on school funding



Knocking on doors over the election period it became clear school funding was a major issue, and I vowed if I became your MP I would fight for better funding for the area, which is exactly what I have done.

First I met with local headteachers, parents and governors to discuss funding implications for their schools. Armed with that information I immediately requested meetings with the Education Ministers and the Secretary of State and made sure my first

question in Parliament was to call for a Minister from the department to come to the dispatch box and give me reassurances that no school in Tatton would see a funding cut.

Days later I questioned Schools Minister Nick Gibb and was told the area would not see a cut and, although pleased, I wanted figures. I also met the Prime Minister's advisor and worked with fellow local Cheshire MPs to apply more pressure and as a group we met with the Secretary of State.

In the end Government listened and prioritised school funding and allocated an extra £1.3 billion for schools in 2018/19 which is coming from savings from existing budgets including spending on free schools.

The Government has said that spending per pupil will rise. At the time of this bulletin being published exact allocations have not been announced - the Minister said schools would find out their funding sometime in the autumn - but rest assured I will continue to fight for the best settlement possible for Tatton's schools.

As a Conservative MP I will seek to support the Government to get its legislation through whenever possible, but my priority is Tatton and I made it clear to the Government I could not support them on changes to school funding if our local pupils would lose out.

RAIL MINISTER VISITS TATTON

ANOTHER major issue locally is the public transport links. I'm working with community groups on bus links and I'm bringing the Rail Minister here to push for improvements on the Mid Cheshire rail links.

The railways lines exist, most of the infrastructure is in place but over the years the rail connections have ceased.

Rail Minister Paul Maynard has heard my views on this matter and now he is coming to Tatton to meet representatives from the Mid Cheshire Rail Users Association, local residents and businesses and to see for himself what is needed.

At the meeting we will all set out the case for expanding the rail network across Cheshire, linking Knutsford to the airport and Sandbach to Northwich - vital connections locally - and explain the problems inadequate links cause for the area.

HAS THE CASE BEEN MADE FOR HS2?



Having met with residents and campaigning groups across Tatton and the North West their answer to the above question is 'No it has not.' In fact, the answer that keeps coming back is that what the

North really needs is a link from East to West - a CrossRail for the North - connecting all the great northern cities; Manchester, Sheffield, Liverpool, Leeds and Newcastle and added to that better connections across Cheshire, particularly if we are to have more homes built here, and if we want our world leading businesses to continue to expand.

Whilst there might be an argument for bringing HS2 to Crewe - rejuvenating Crewe as a great railway hub for the North - just providing a single HS2 line North to South doesn't stack up, practically or financially.
